Occupying a quarter of the agricultural land in Japan,

Hokkaido is truly a food base for Japan. The area of farmland owned by each household is large, and mechanization is advanced. Also, dairy farming is flourishing, utilizing the large pastures.

In particular, many dairy cows are raised here, and Hokkaido has more than a 50% share of Japan's raw milk. The coastline of Hokkaido is 4,402km long. This is 12.5% of Japan's length.

It is surrounded by the Sea of Japan, the Pacific Ocean, and the Sea of Okhotsk

Hokkaido's fishery production accounts for about a quarter of Japan's total and is Japan's number one in terms of fishery workers and fishing boats.







History and **Culture**

Unique past and culture

The history of Hokkaido dates back to about 20,000 years ago, before the Jomon period. Some of the Jomon archaeological sites in the prefecture have been registered as World Heritage sites. The era from the 13th century into the Edo period (1603-1868) is characterized as an age of culture of the Ainu people. In 1859, Hakodate opened as an international trading port. In 1869, the Meiji government changed the name of the region from 'Ezochi' to 'Hokkaido' and took on the development of Hokkaido.

Over the 150 years since the start of Hokkaido's development, settlers from all over Japan brought their dialects and local cultures from their old hometowns. Hokkaido's lifestyle culture and dialects were born.





Nature

The northern land that the rich nature nurtures

Located in the northernmost part of Japan, Hokkaido has its unique natural environment. Spring with flowers blooming all at once.

A refreshing summer with low humidity. Autumn when the mountains are dyed with red leaves. And winter, where you can enjoy a snowy wonder world.

The nature of Hokkaido presents a variety of expressions with clear changes along the four seasons.

In addition, Hokkaido is home to different types of wildlife such as in Shiretoko, a registered World Heritage Site, Kushiro-shitsugen wetland, Japan's largest of its kind, and the magnificent mountain range of Daisetsuzan.







Ainu traditional culture throughout Hokkaido

Since ancient times, centred around Hokkaido, the Ainu have a unique own language, 'Ainu', and they have developed a rich culture represented by oral literature, traditional rituals, and distinctive

In recent years, activities to actively learn and convey traditional culture such as ceremonies and events have become popular. The manga 'Golden Kamuy' won a

Manga Award, and in July 2020, the Upopoy National Ainu Museum and Park opened in the town of Shiraoi.



The Hokkaido Shinkansen (Shin-Aomori → Shin-Hakodate Hokuto) started operations in March 2016, connecting Hokkaido and Tokyo in about four hours. At the end of 2030, it will be furthermore extended to Sapporo, and become even more convenient.



Ferries connecting Hokkaido and Honshu arrive and depart at Tomakomai, Muroran, Otaru and Hakodate, Tomakomai, which has the most routes to Honshu, has two terminals, including routes to Hachinohe, Akita, Sendai, Niigata, Oarai, Tsuruga, and Nagoya.


